DESK OF THE GRAND KNIGHT

I was privileged this summer to be selected as one of eleven Wisconsin State Delegates to the Supreme Convention. This year's 128th Annual meeting was held August 3rd through the 5th in Washington D.C. The opening mass was at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, I'm not sure of the numbers, but there were more Priests, Bishops and Cardinals there than I have ever seen, the procession with the Fourth Degree Honor Guard leading the way must have lasted a good 15-20 minutes. In his homily Archbishop Wuerl, Archbishop of Washington D.C. said "The theme for this Supreme Convention of the Knights, "I Am My Brother's Keeper," highlights the commitment of service and the works of charity that have been intrinsic to our order since its beginning. Father Michael J. McGivney, Servant of



God, understood with a piercing insight guided by the Holy Spirit that God's love made manifest in Christ is supposed to be reflected and shared in our care for one another. We are our brother's keeper. The very origins of our order are rooted in the recognition that we are called to exercise a ministry of service and charity." The very essence of being a member of the Knights of Columbus is that we may serve not just each other, but those less fortunate in our society.

I came away from the convention with a better sense of what we as an organization are capable of doing and a better sense that belonging to the Knights can be a real vocation. It is my hope that in the coming months we can translate the theme of "I am

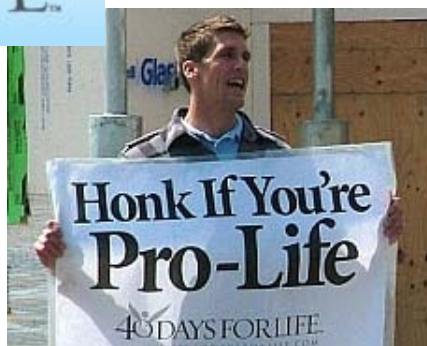

## Knights to Pray Worldwide Rosary of Guadalupan Love

Knights of Columbus and their families around the world will unite under the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe to pray the Rosary of Guadalupan Love on Sept. 8, the Universal Day of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

“On Sept. 8, we will pray the rosary for Our Lady’s intercession for unity and peace,” said Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson. “We will pray that the new evangelization will cause the Culture of Life to flourish on all continents and among all people, and that Our Lady of Guadalupe intercedes with her Son to guide our councils in their charitable work.”

The Rosary of Guadalupan Love will be prayed in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City, Sept. 8 from 9-10 p.m. (ET). This special worldwide rosary is being organized by the Knights of Columbus, the Archdiocese of Mexico City and the Institute of Guadalupan Studies in observance of the bicentennial of Mexico’s independence.

The event honors Our Lady of Guadalupe as the “Shield and the Patroness of Our Liberty” and as the Mother of the Civilization of Love.

The Rosary of Guadalupan Love is designed to connect the messages Our Lady of Guadalupe gave to St. Juan Diego with the seven sacraments of the Church and the Church as the sacrament of salvation.

“The message of Our Lady of Guadalupe is a message that reflects the great commandment of our Lord to love our neighbors as ourselves (Mt 22:39),” the supreme knight said. “It is a universal message of reconciliation, healing and unity. This event will unite in prayer all Knights and their families, and all dioceses of the Church throughout the world.”

The intention of the Rosary of Guadalupan Love is to celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe’s role in uniting the hemisphere and her important role in building a Civilization of Love.

The worldwide appeal of Our Lady of Guadalupe is reflected in her many titles, including the Patroness of all America, the Patroness of Mexico, the Patroness of the Philippines, Patroness of the Unborn, Star of the New World, Star of the New Evangelization and Mother of the Civilization of Love.

When he took office as supreme knight in October, 2000, Carl Anderson dedicated his administration to Our Lady of Guadalupe, renewing devotion to her throughout the Order.

“Pope Benedict XVI has reminded us that through the love of Our Lady of Guadalupe we can hear and respond to the words of Christ: ‘Go therefore and make disciples of all nations’ (Mt 28:19),” Supreme Knight Anderson added.

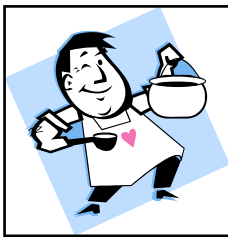

Knights of Columbus Council No. 53821 invites all students in grades 7 through 12 to compete in our statewide annual Respect for Life essay contest.

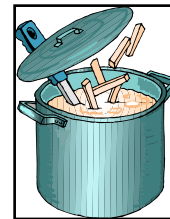
Essays are to be written during the month of October. Copies of Student Information Sheet and Student
